MSRT Members,

Over the last several months, I have struggled to process what I was seeing on the news, on social media, and in my own community. My struggle, as a male with white privilege, pales in comparison to the appalling violence experienced by members of the black community and other individuals of color that have existed for centuries and been so prominent in the media recently. I recognize this is not about me. However, I am using this opportunity to listen and participate in very thoughtful conversations surrounding social justice, hear concerns from fellow RTRs about issues their patients are experiencing, talk to my own children, and try to navigate how I can further educate myself to be a better parent, health care provider, director, and leader within our profession.

Despite my efforts, I wish I could tell you that I have figured something out. I have not. Instead, I find myself feeling embarrassed. Embarrassed that I identify with a privileged class of citizens that has let this occur for years and at times dismissed it without making a real effort to do anything about it. I am frustrated. Frustrated that we don't have the solution that can make all of this better. I am confused. Confused that I am not doing the right thing and questioning if what I am doing will help or hurt those that need me to do better. I am afraid. Afraid of doing the wrong thing, but also afraid that if we don't do something, nothing will change. However, I do know one thing. In this current situation, my feelings should not be a priority. I need to care more about the feelings of others and how my actions can positively impact those around me. No one should have to worry about getting killed while going out for a run, worry about someone calling the police because of the color of their skin, or worry about how they will be treated when they encounter a member of law enforcement.

Two years ago, I had the privilege of becoming president of our society. I hoped I would be able to make a positive impact, and I envisioned many, but certainly not the vast variety of opportunities that would be presented to me. There have been many issues to deal with recently. We have many members dealing with the impact of COVID-19, and many of those members feel they have been underrepresented for years and see a national and local leadership that they have a hard time identifying with. We have members that wonder what the MSRT is doing for them... Our organization has had many active and engaged leaders, and I hope, as incoming Chairman of the Board, to work with the rest of our leadership and membership to continue to build on what has been established.

As the MSRT President, I can ensure you that I, along with the MSRT Board of Directors and many others in the radiography community, am committed to being an advocate for all of our members and for the profession. With everything we do, we must focus on enhancing diversity, inclusion, equity and social justice. As health care providers, we must be culturally sensitive advocates for patients and always keep their best interests in mind. We can and must be better to meet the needs of our patients, members, and individuals in our communities.


Little on personal life:


"Congratulations!"


